MNR Lake Fact Sheets Now Online

Information on lakes in the Muskoka and Parry Sound districts is now easier to access, thanks to a partnership between The District Municipality of Muskoka, Ministry of Natural Resources and the Parry Sound-Muskoka Stewardship Network.

MNR lake fact sheets are now available on the [Muskoka Water Web](#). The fact sheets include basic information such as lake location, size and depth, as well as detailed information on fish species and fisheries management.

Currently, fact sheets are available for about 450 lakes, with about 700 to be available when the project is complete. Funding was provided through the [Parry Sound-Muskoka Stewardship Network](#).
